
TREAT **YOURSELF:** Marlborough residents love Trombetta's ice cream in the summer. but not everyone knows it's open during the holiday season as

MEET OUR NEW RESIDENTS



Jan and Jim traveled extensively in Europe and the United States. She enjoys flower arranging, painting, and knitting.




