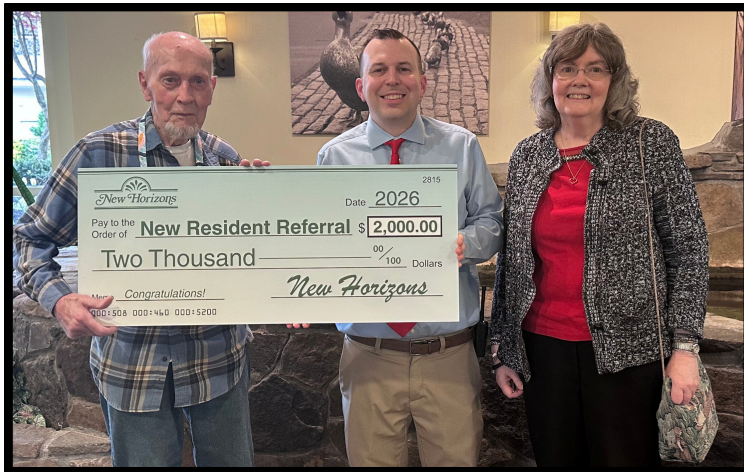

Bird feeders

To ensure a clean, safe, and balanced environment for all residents and local wildlife, traditional bird feeders **are not** permitted at New Horizons. (These devices tend to attract larger birds, rodents, and other animals that can create mess, noise, and potential health concerns.)

Residents are, however, welcome to maintain hummingbird feeders, which are specifically designed to attract only hummingbirds. Please take care to keep all hummingbird feeders clean and filled with the appropriate nectar to support these small pollinators while preserving the overall harmony of the community.
